



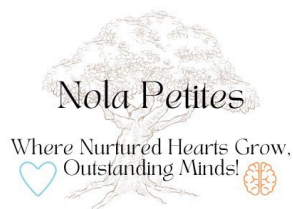
Welcome to Nola Petites LLC!

Tuition Information and Policy

Checks returned for non-sufficient funds or for any reason will be subject to a \$75 charge.

No refunds are given for absences, this includes emergencies by the city, state, or federal shutdowns or any (closures) due to disaster emergencies. This also applies for holidays when the school is closed. Parents must obligate and register for the whole term January - December of any given year. Absolutely no exceptions will be made. If you fail to comply with our tuition policies, your child(ren) will be dismissed from the Nola Petites.

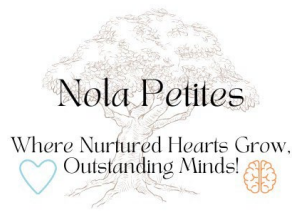
Classes are Montessori Style Multi-Looping age grouped

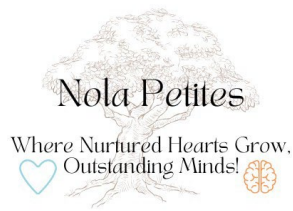

Preschool Learning Environment

Our school-learning introduces children to the joy of learning at an early age and provides a framework in which intellectual and social development go hand in hand. In order to develop his or her physical and intellectual powers to the fullest, the child must have freedom - a freedom achieved only through order and self-discipline.

Through the defined order of the environment the child gradually creates order and learns to distinguish among his or her impressions and gains of self and the environment. The "prepared environment" of the learning centers in each path possesses order and disposes children to develop at their own speed according to a child's own capabilities and sensitivities and in a non-competitive atmosphere. The years between 3 and 5 years are when a child most easily learns the ground rules of human behavior (good habits and manners). The method by which children are taught might be called "programs learning". The structure of our learning environment involves the use of teaching materials designed to test each one's understanding and to correct his or her errors. The only valid impulse to learning is the self-motivation of the child. Children move themselves towards learning. The teacher prepares the environment, programs the activity, functions as the reference person an exemplar, offers stimulation, but it is the child who learns, who is motivated through the work itself to persist in a chosen task. In addition to our carefully prepared learning environment, we will be incorporating some traditional education methods to prepare the children for kindergarten class.



Disciplinary Policy

The timeout policy is used, but the child is given a decision to sit by their cubby for 2 -5 (given age) minutes or complete a task given.

No child or group of children shall be allowed to discipline another child.

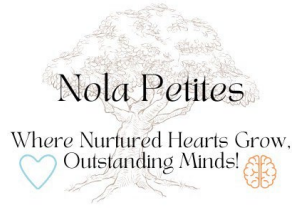
No child shall be deprived of meals or any part of meals for disciplinary reasons.

No child should be put in time out under the age of 2.

Abuse and Neglect

Any suspected abuse and/or neglect of a child in a daycare center must be reported in accordance with Louisiana revised statutes 14:403.

1. This statement shall be included in your written policy.
2. Cruel, severe, unusual, or unnecessary punishment shall not be inflicted on children.
3. Derogatory remarks shall not be made in the presence of children about:
 - a. Play my numbers of child(ren) in care or
 - b. About the child(ren) themselves

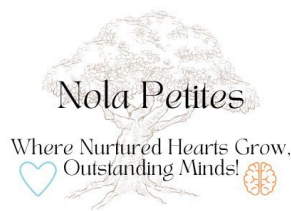

Sick/ School Policy

The Nola Petites understands that it is difficult for a parent/guardian to leave or miss work; therefore, it is suggested that alternative arrangements be made for occasions when children must remain at home or be picked up due to illness. Exclusion from the center is sometimes necessary either to reduce the transmission of illness or because the center is not able to adequately meet the needs of the child. Mild illnesses are common among children, and infections are often spread before the onset of any symptoms. In these cases, we try to keep the children comfortable throughout the day.

Reasons for The Nola Petites to exclude children include (but are not limited to) the following: Fever of 100.04 degrees or above.

Diarrhea: watery stools or decreased form of stool not associated with change of diet; stool not contained in the diaper; child unable to reach the toilet; or stool frequency that exceeds 2 or more stools above normal for that child.

Vomiting more than 2 times in the previous 24 hours (unless the vomiting is determined to be caused by a non-communicable condition and the child is not in danger of dehydration such as acid reflux students may return **with** a doctor's note).

Skin sores weeping fluid and on an exposed area that cannot be covered.

Conjunctivitis (defined as pink or red conjunctiva with white or yellow eye discharge) until antibiotics for 24 hours.

Impetigo or any other unexplained rashes until 24 hours after treatment has been started or a doctor's note is received that it is non-contagious.

Strep throat (or other streptococcal infection) until 24 hours after treatment has been started.

For your child's comfort, and to reduce the risk of contagion, we ask that children be picked up within 1.5 hours of notification.



Illness Return Policy

Children who have been excluded may return when:

- They are free of fever, vomiting, and diarrhea for a full 24 hours.
- Readmission after diarrhea can occur when diapered children have their stool contained by the diaper (even if stools remain loose) and when toilet-trained children do not have toileting accidents.
- They have been treated with an antibiotic for a full 24 hours.
- They are able to participate comfortably in all usual program activities, including outdoor time.
- They are free of open, oozing skin conditions and drooling (not related to teething)
- The child's medical provider signs a note stating that the child's condition is not contagious, and the involved areas can be covered by a bandage without seepage or drainage through the bandage.

If a child is excluded because of a reportable communicable disease, a note from the child's medical provider stating that the child is no longer contagious and may return is required. The final decision on whether to exclude a child from the program due to illness will be made by the childcare center.

Note: Notes allowing for a child's return to the center after exclusion due to illness must originate from the child's medical provider. A note written and signed by the child's parent/guardian who is also a physician is not acceptable.
